

Sue Lloyd, BV County Auditor and Commissioner of Elections was our Tuesday morning guest speaker. Tuesday Nov. 6 is Election Day. As was the case last year, this year's ballot will be printed in English and Spanish. If 5% of population in a given area is of a different ethnic group the ballots have to be printed in the two predominant languages. By 2019 this will be a requirement. Polls are open from 7am-9pm on Nov. 6. An absentee ballot may be cast for those people gone on election day. To date 1600 absentee ballots have been cast in BV County. A sample ballot was printed in local newspapers Oct. 17. When you come to vote some form of proof of eligibility is required. This could be in the form of a driver's license, birth certificate, marriage certificate, passport, voter I.D. card etc. Helpers are needed at all polling places. People who are bilingual in English and Spanish are much in need.
