

Kayla Wilson, President of PTO Alta School talked to us about updating Alta's playground. The original playground is 30 years old and was built as a community endeavor involving the school, City of Alta, and community members to construct a wooden playground. Hence the term "Altogether". Over years the playground has begun to deteriorate due to exposure to the elements. The PTO recognized a need to update and modernize the facility and has been successful in acquiring grants from BV Foundation, NE/IA Kiwanis grants, and holding a silent auction in January. New playground equipment will be made of plastic or pressed wood which looks like wood but is plastic. Construction is to begin late spring early summer. Projected cost is around \$200,000. During a four year timeline the old wooden facility will be torn down and replaced by plastic equipment. Thus far 6 swings have been approved for purchase.
